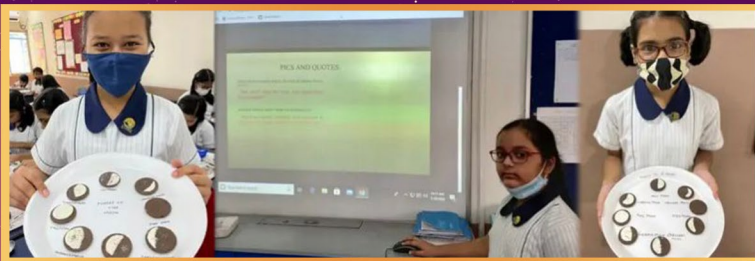
## Independence Day (Special Assembly)
